

Sexual Assault: From the beginning

2014



January 23: Former Baylor football player [Tevin Elliott](#) receives [20-year-long prison sentence](#) without probation for sexual assaults committed in 2009 and 2012.

2015

August 12: Former Baylor football player [Sam Ukwuachu](#) receives a [six-month prison sentence](#) and [10 years of probation](#) for assaulting a female athlete.



September 2: Baylor regents hire [Philadelphia Law Firm Pepper Hamilton](#) to conduct internal investigation into the university's handling of sexual assault cases.



2016



February 6: [Students hold candlelight vigil for victims of sexual assault](#) outside President and Chancellor Ken Starr's house. Starr sends out email to students expressing his understanding of their frustration.

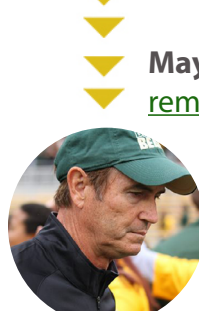
March 22: Board of Regents announce \$5 million plan to expand the counseling services offered by the university.



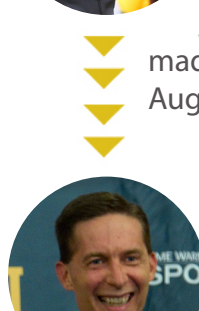
March 31: Jasmin Hernandez, one of the women Elliott assaulted, [files lawsuit against Baylor with San Diego-based Zalkin Law firm.](#)



May 13: The Board of Regents have their annual spring meeting and is [briefed on the Pepper Hamilton findings.](#)



May 26: The [Board of Regents remove Starr as president and Art Briles as head football coach](#) based on the findings from Pepper Hamilton. Athletic Director Ian McCaw is put on probation. [Starr releases a statement](#) saying he was not made aware of the assaults until August 2015.



May 30: Ian McCaw resigns from his position as athletic director, Jim Grobe is hired as the new head football coach.



June 2: [Starr resigns from his position as Chancellor](#) to speak freely and call for transparency from the Board of Regents.



July 13: Mack Rhoades is recruited as the new athletic director.



July 20: [Shawn Oakman is indicted](#) on a sexual assault charge. Oakman is accused of sexually assaulting a Baylor student on April 3.
